

AFRICAN SAFARI CLOTHING & EQUIPMENT LIST

A. GUNS

- One Mid-Range Caliber Rifle
 - o .270, .308, 7mm, .30-06, .338
 - Variable power scope (2x7, 3x9, etc.)
 - Rifle sling
 - Minimum 40 rounds of ammunition (soft point)
 - Airline-approved locking hard case
 - Soft gun case or sock case
 - Belt-style cartridge holder
- One Light Rifle (optional)
 - Any of the .2x calibers for very small game (.222, .243, etc.)
 - Variable power scope (2x7, 3x9, etc.)
 - Rifle sling
 - Minimum 40 rounds of ammunition
 - Airline-approved locking hard case
 - Soft gun case or sock case

B. CLOTHING

- 3 Pairs of trousers*
- 3 Shirts long sleeve*
- 1 Hunting coat or lightweight jacket or vest
- 1 Hat your choice
- 5 Undershorts
- 5 Undershirts
- 5 Pairs of Socks
- 1 Belt
- 1 Pair of comfortable camp shoes
- 1 Pair of lightweight leather boots similar to bird hunting boots
- 1 Down vest or wool sweater
- 1 Pair of lightweight gloves

Laundry is done in camp on a daily basis; the iron content in the water is sometimes high so whites can become dingy or "yellowed."

*We recommend khaki, green or dark colors made of a smooth, tightly woven material (no denim!). Most hunting clothes found in the United States are suitable. Avoid very light-colored clothing.

C. MISCELLANEOUS

- Chapstick
- Suntan lotion
- Sunglasses
- Extra pair of prescription glasses
- Camera with extra batteries for camera and flash
- Extra film or memory cards for digital cameras
- Video camera (optional) with extra batteries
- Chargers for digital camera and video camera

- Binoculars (one pair per person traveling)
- Personal travel kit (razors, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.)
- Candy (optional, but advisable if you have a sweet tooth)
- Small flashlight with extra batteries
- Hand lotion
- Tick repellent (Deet, etc.)
- International voltage converter (Radio Shack has several models)

D. DOCUMENTS AND OTHER

- Passport (must be valid for 6 months after your return date and have at least 1 blank page; advisable to carry photocopy of passport in separate bag/suitcase and leave second copy at home)
- Travel documents (airline tickets, itinerary, hotel reservations, etc.)
- Visa, when required (not required for US citizens in many African countries but be sure to check)
- Reading material
- Emergency contact information
- Confirmation numbers for cars, hotels, etc.
- Money (remember, pack half as much clothes and take twice as much money as you think you'll need)
- Medical records (none required for many African countries but be sure to check)
